

IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING RETIREE PHARMACY BENEFITS

- All members will receive new Express Script ID cards mid to late December to start using effective 1/1/2014.
- Change to Express Scripts will not impact co-pay structure, mandatory mail opt-out and mandatory generic program
- Express Scripts provides access to a large national retail pharmacy network
- Express Scripts provides access for mail order prescriptions
- Members may see movement in regards to formulary co-pays.
- Members will have a 90-day grace period ending 3/31/2014 to make changes to preferred brand drugs
- Retail Prescriptions
 - Show new ID card at the pharmacy after 01/01/2014
 - Retail prescriptions do not need to be transferred
- Mail Order, Specialty, and Prior Authorizations
 - Express Scripts will work with current vendor to transition open mail order prescriptions
 - Some prescriptions are excluded (i.e. narcotics and expired prescriptions) and will require new prescriptions
 - If the member has the ability to fill a mail order prescription prior to 12/31/2013, they should do so with current vendor
 - Specialty prescriptions will transfer as well with the open refill transfers
 - Express Scripts will work with current vendor to transfer existing Prior Authorizations
