APPEAL OF LT. JOHN HEALY
Docket #91-T-7

November 13, 1990

By letter dated October 23, 1990, SEA General Counsel Reynolds filed on behalf of the above-named John Healy an appeal of his discharge from employment with the N.H. Division of State Police, and requested that "...the Board take no further action on this matter at the present time".

Per-A 202.01 (b) of the Rules of the Personnel Appeals Board provides that:

"Such notice of appeal shall state the action complained of, and shall contain a detailed description of why the appellant believes the action was inappropriate." (Emphasis added.)

Mr. Healy has given no description of the action complained of, other than to state that he was a permanent employee of the Division of State Police at the time of his termination on October 8, 1990. Further, Mr. Healy has provided no grounds for his appeal, and has offered no reason why he believes the discharge to be inappropriate. Mr. Healy merely argues that "...the Board in its statutory discretion would agree that he should not have been terminated".

The Board finds Mr. Healy's appeal to be completely deficient and, as such, has voted unanimously to dismiss his appeal.
