

Request for Bid: Test Borings- Downings Landing Boat Access Facility, Alton, NH

Dear Sir/Madam:

The following information is provided to clarify three questions below.

1. Question:

How long does the turbidity curtain need to remain in-place?

Answer:

The turbidity curtain around borings B-4 and B-5 shall remain in place until the turbidity has returned to normal conditions within the contained area. This time will extend beyond the two days allotted for the actual drilling and sampling activities in the Scope of Work.

2. Question:

Do we have to measure the water depth at the locations of boreholes B-4 and B-5?

Answer:

The Contractor shall measure the water depth and record the value to the nearest one-tenth-of-an-inch (1/10-inch) along with the date of the measurement. This information shall be submitted to the Engineer by the Contractor.

3. Question:

Is the Contractor required to survey the as-built locations of the boreholes?

Answer:

The Contractor shall work cooperatively with the Engineer to survey the locations of the boreholes and report the survey information to the Engineer. The survey shall be accurate to within one (1) foot. The survey shall be completed by triangulation using a compass and tape tied to permanent nearby features on the property or by other survey methods sufficient to provide the required accuracy. A minimum of three different compass bearing (directions) separated by at least 40 degrees shall be measured and recorded. The compass bearing shall be recorded to the nearest half degree (0.5 degree). The distances along a bearing shall be recorded to the nearest one-tenth-of-an-inch (1/10-inch). The permanent features used in the survey shall be identified to the Engineer and marked with flagging for future recovery by NHFG personnel.
